

## [Jeremiah]

Jer 1: The LORD calls Jeremiah to be HIS prophet.

Jer 1:4 Then the word of the LORD came unto me saying,

Jer 1:5 Before I formed thee in the belly I knew thee; and before thou camest forth out of the womb I sanctified thee, and I ordained thee a prophet unto the nation.

Jer 2 The LORD asks Jeremiah to remind the people of the days of blessing and deliverance; and chastises them for forsaking HIM and seeking other gods.

Jer 3:25 We lie down in our shame, and our confusion covereth us: for we have sinned against the LORD our GOD, we and our fathers, from our youth even unto this day, and have not obeyed the voice of our GOD.

Jer 4: I & thou will return O Israel saith the LORD, return unto me: and if thou wilt put away thine abominations out of my sight, then thou shalt not remove.

Jer 5 The LORD finds no just men in Israel or Judah. Punishment is foretold, but not total destruction for their sins.

Jer 6:1-8 The invasion of Judea is foretold.

Jer 6:9-17 The justice of GOD's proceedings.

Jer 6:18-30 All attempts to bring them back failed.

Jer 6 The LORD says: Come back to ME and I will help you.

## [Jeremiah] cont. 2

Jer 10:24 O LORD, correct me but with judgment, not with thine anger, lest thou bring me to nothing.

Jer 11 The LORD's message on the broken covenant.

Jer 11:1 The word of the LORD that came to Jeremiah saying,

Jer 11:2 Hear ye the words of this covenant, and speak to the men of Judah, and to the inhabitants of Jerusalem;

Jer 11:3 And say thou unto them Thus saith the LORD GOD of Israel; Cursed be the man that obeyeth not the words of this covenant,

Jer 11:4 Which I commanded your fathers in the day that I brought them forth out of the land of Egypt, from the iron furnace saying, Obey MY voice, and do them according to all which I command you: so shall ye be my people, and I will be your GOD:

Jer 12 Jeremiah's prayer concerning the prosperity of the wicked, and the LORD's answer.

Jer 13 The LORD uses a girdle or belt to show Jeremiah how the people of Israel were once close to HIM, and have now gone astray.

Jer 13:1 Thus saith the LORD unto me get thee a linen girdle, and put it upon thy loins, and put it not in water.

Jer 13:3 And the word of the LORD came to me a second time, saying,

Jer 13:4 Take the girdle that thou hast got, which is upon thy loins, and arise, go to Euphrates, and hide it there in a hole of the rock.

## [Jeremiah] cont.

Jer 7:1 The word that came to Jeremiah from the LORD, saying,

Jer 7:2 Stand in the gate of the LORD's house, and proclaim there this word and say, Hear the WORD of the LORD, all ye of Judah, that enter in at these gates to worship the LORD.

Jer 7:3 Thus saith the LORD of Hosts, the GOD of Israel, Amend your ways and your doing, and I will cause you to dwell in this place.

Jer 8 The failure of the people to listen to GOD's WORD.

Jer 8:20 The harvest is past, the summer is ended, and we are not saved.

Jer 9:23-24 Understanding and knowing the LORD is MOST important. GLORIFY HIM.

Jer 9:23 Thus saith the LORD Let not the wise man glory in his wisdom, neither let the mighty man glory in his might, let not the rich man glory in his riches:

Jer 9:24 But let him that glorieth, glory in this, that he understandeth and knoweth ME, that I AM the LORD which exercise lovingkindness, judgement, and righteousness, in the earth: for in these things I delight, saith the LORD.

Jer 10:10 But the LORD is the true GOD HE is the living GOD, and an everlasting KING.

## [Jeremiah] cont. 3

Jer 13:5 So I went, and hid it by Euphrates, as the LORD commanded me.

Jer 13:6 And it came to pass after many days, that the LORD said unto me, Arise, go to Euphrates, and take the girdle from thence, which I commanded thee to hide there.

Jer 13:7 Then I went to Euphrates, and digged, and took the girdle from the place where I had hid it: and, behold, the girdle was marred, it was profitable for nothing.

Jer 13:15-21 Jeremiah is told to warn the people

Jer 13:22-27 Punishment is for their own actions.

Jer 13:23 Can the Ethiopian change his skin, or the leopard his spots? then may ye also do good, that are accustomed to do evil.

Jer 14:13-16 False prophets to die by the sword.

Jer 15:6 Thou hast forsaken ME saith the LORD, thou art gone backward: therefore will I stretch out MY hand against thee, and destroy thee; I am weary with repecting.

Jer 15:10-21 Jeremiah complains to the LORD and is reprimanded. But, the LORD promises Jeremiah that he shall prevail in the end.

Jer 16 The LORD tells Jeremiah about the punishment of Israel for serving other gods.

Jer 17:7 Blessed is the man that trusteth in the LORD, and whose hope the LORD is.

Jer 17:10 If the LORD search the heart...

### [Jeremiah] cont. 4

Jer 17:14 Heal me, O LORD, and I shall be healed; save me, and I shall be saved: for thou art my praise.

Jer 17:17 Be not a terror unto me: thou art my hope in the day of evil.

Jer 17:21-22 Do no work on the Sabbath, but hallow ye the Sabbath day.

Jer 18:1-6 The LORD tells Jeremiah of the Potter and his Clay, and so it is with the LORD and all of us.

We are remade in CHRIST!

Jer 19 The LORD tells Jeremiah to take an earthen bottle and break it to demonstrate the coming destruction of Judah and Jerusalem.

Jer 20 Pashur, the governor of the LORD's house, strikes Jeremiah and puts him in the stocks as punishment for speaking the LORD's words.

Jer 20:7-18 Jeremiah complains of his hard times and wishes that he had not been born.

Even the LORD's prophets become downtrodden and need lifting by HIS HOLY SPIRIT.

Jer 20:13 Sing unto the LORD praise ye the LORD: for HE hath delivered the soul of the poor from the hand of evildoers.

Jer 21 Jeremiah tells King Hezekiah of the coming captivity of Judah.

Jer 22 The LORD tells Jeremiah to warn the kings of Judah of their demise.

### [Jeremiah] cont. 6

Jer 27:2 Thus saith the LORD to me; Make thee bonds and yokes, and put them upon thy neck,

Jer 27:3-11 The neighboring nations of Edom, Moab, Ammon, Tyre, and Zidon are to receive the yokes as a sign to submit to King Nebuchadnezzar or be destroyed.

Jer 27:12-18 King Zedekiah is also warned to submit to Nebuchadnezzar.

Jer 27:19-22 The vessels of the temple are to be carried to Babylon, but afterwards are to be returned.

Jer 28 A False prophet, Hananiah, opposes Jeremiah.

Jer 28:10-17 Jeremiah warns the False prophet of his immediate death, and the False Prophet dies.

Jer 29 Jeremiah writes a letter to the Jews in captivity at Babylon. He tells them they will be there a long time.

Jer 29:10 For thus saith the LORD, That after seventy years be accomplished at Babylon I will visit you, and perform my good word toward you, it causing you to return to this place.

Jer 29:13 And ye shall seek ME, and find ME when ye shall search for ME with all your heart.

Jer 30 The First Writings of Jeremiah

Jer 30:2 Thus speaketh the LORD GOD of Israel, saying, Write thee all the words that I have spoken to thee in a book.

### [Jeremiah] cont. 5

Jer 23:1 Woe be unto the pastors that destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture! saith the LORD.

Jer 23:5 Prediction of Righteous BRANCH

Behold, the days come, saith the LORD, that I will raise unto David a righteous Branch, and a king shall reign and prosper, and shall execute judgement and justice in the earth.

Jer 23:6 In HIS days Judah shall be saved, and Israel shall dwell safely: and this is HIS name whereby HE shall be called, THE LORD OUR RIGHTEOUSNESS.

Jer 23:9-40 False prophets denounced

Jer 24 The LORD tells Jeremiah of the good signs vs. the evil signs. And so will it be with HIS people.

Jer 24:7 And I will give them an heart to know ME that I AM the LORD: and they shall be MY people, and I will be their GOD: for they shall return unto ME with their whole heart.

Jer 25 Prediction of 70 years of captivity and Armageddon.

Jer 26 The Priests and Prophets seek Jeremiah's death, but the Princes spare him.

Jer 27 The LORD tells Jeremiah to make yokes, and put them about his neck as a sign of the bondage to come.

### [Jeremiah] cont. 7

Jer 31:31 Behold, the days come, saith the LORD, that I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel, and with the house of Judah:

Jer 31:33 But this shall be the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel; After those days, saith the LORD, I will put my law in their inward parts, and write it in their hearts: and will be their GOD, and they shall be my people.

Jer 31:34 And they shall teach no more every man his neighbour, and every man his brother, saying, Know the LORD: for they shall all know ME, from the least of them to the greatest of them, saith the LORD: for I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more.

### Through JESUS CHRIST

Jer 32 Jeremiah buys the field from his cousin Hanameel as a sign of his faith that Jesus would once again own land in Israel, rather than a Babylonian king.

Jer 32:15 For thus saith the LORD of Hosts, the GOD of Israel; Houses and fields and vine yards shall be possessed again in this land.

Jer 32:42 For thus saith the LORD; Like as I have brought all this great evil upon this people so will I bring upon them all the good that I have promised them.

## [Jeremiah] cont. 8

Jer 33:1 The Great Prophecy concerning the Davidic Kingdom and the coming of the BRANCH of Righteousness.

Jer 33:1 Moreover the word of the LORD came unto Jeremiah, the second time, while he was yet shut up in the court of the prison, saying,

Jer 33:2 Thus saith the LORD the maker thereof, the LORD that formed it to establish it; the LORD is HIS name.

Jer 33:3 Call unto ME and I will answer thee, and shew thee great and mighty things, which thou knowest not.

Jer 33:14 Behold, the days come, saith the LORD, that I will perform that good thing which I have promised unto the house of Israel and to the house of Judah.

Jer 33:15 In those days, and at that time, will I cause the BRANCH of RIGHTEOUSNESS to grow up unto David; and HE shall execute judgement and righteousness in the land.

Jer 33:16 In those days shall Judah be saved, and Jerusalem shall dwell safely: and this is the name wherewith she shall be called: The LORD our RIGHTEOUSNESS.

Jer 34:1-7 Zedekiah is warned about his coming captivity.

Jer 34:8-22 The men of Judah fail to abide by the LORD's command to set their servants free.

Jer 35:1-11 The LORD asks Jeremiah to gather the Rechabites and test them.

## [Jeremiah] cont. 10

Jer 36:3 It may be that the house of Judah will hear all the evil which I purpose to do unto them; that they may return every man from his evil way; that I may forgive their iniquity and their sin.

Jer 36:9-26 The words are read to the people, to the princes, and to king Zedekiah. The king burns the scroll in defiance.

Jer 36:27-32 The LORD asks Jeremiah to prepare another scroll, and all the words were rewritten and more words added.

Jer 37 Jeremiah is imprisoned by the princes of Judah.

Jer 37:15 Wherefore the princes were wroth with Jeremiah, and smote him, and put him in prison in the house of Jonathan the scribe: for they had made that the prison.

Jer 38 Jeremiah is cast into a dungeon, from whence he is delivered by an Ethiopian.

Jer 38:6 Then took they Jeremiah, and cast him into the dungeon of Malchiah the son of Hammelech, that was in the court of the prison and they let down Jeremiah with cords. And in the dungeon there was no water, but mire: so Jeremiah sank in the mire.

Jer 38:10 Then the king commanded Ebed-melech the Ethiopian, saying, Take from hence thirty men with thee, and take up Jeremiah the prophet out of the dungeon, before he die.

## [Jeremiah] cont. 9

Jer 35:5 And I set before the sons of the house of the Rechabites pots full of wine, and cups, and I said unto them, Drink ye wine.

Jer 35:6 But they said, We will drink no wine for Jonadab the son of Rechab our father commanded us, saying, Ye shall drink no wine, neither ye, nor your sons forever:

Jer 35:7 Neither shall ye build house, nor sow seed, nor plant vineyard, nor have any: but all your days ye shall dwell in tents; that ye may live many days in the land where ye be strangers.

Jer 35:8 Thus here we obeyed the voice of Jonadab the son of Rechab our father in all that he hath charged us...

Jer 35:12-17 The Rechabites' obedience contrasted with Judah's disobedience.

Jer 35:19 Therefore thus saith the LORD of Hosts, the God of Israel, Jonadab the son of Rechab shall not want a man to stand before me forever.

Jer 36 The LORD asks Jeremiah to tell Baruch the scribe to write all the words given to Jeremiah by the LORD on a scroll to be read to all people.

Jer 36:2 Take thee a roll of a book and write therein all the words that I have spoken unto thee against Israel, and against Judah, and against all the nations, from the day I spake unto thee, from the days of Josiah, even unto this day.

## [Jeremiah] cont. 11

Jer 38:14-28 Jeremiah advises Zedekiah the king to surrender to the Chaldeans.

Jer 39 The final captivity of Judah, and Jeremiah is released.

Jer 39:6 Then the king of Babylon slew the sons of Zedekiah in Riblah before his eyes: also the king of Babylon slew all the nobles of Judah.

Jer 39:7 Moreover he put out Zedekiah's eyes, and bound him with chains, to carry him to Babylon.

Jer 39:11 Now Nebuchadrezzar King of Babylon gave charge concerning Jeremiah to Nebuzar-adan the captain of the guard saying,

Jer 39:12 Take him, and look well to him, and do him no harm; but do unto him even as he shall say unto thee.

Jer 39:15-18 The LORD tells Jeremiah to talk to Ebed-melech and explain that he would not be harmed, because of his faith in God.

Jer 40:1-6 Jeremiah is directed to go to Gedaliah, who has been made Governor over Judah.

Jer 40:7-16 A conspiracy against Gedaliah.

Jer 41 Ishmael kills Gedaliah and carries away captives. Johanan rescues captives.

Jer 42:1-6 Johanan asks Jeremiah to talk to the LORD for the people.

Jer 42:7-22 The LORD tells them to stay in Judea and NOT go to Egypt.

### [Jeremiah] cont. 12

JER 43 Jeremiah is carried to Tahpanhes in Egypt.

Jer 43:1-7 The Jewish leaders disobey the LORD and carry the people to Egypt.  
⇒ Jer 43:8-13 Jeremiah foretells the conquest of Egypt by Nebuchadnezzar, of Babylon.

→ Jer 43:8-10 The sign of the "Hidden Stones"; the king of Babylon will set his throne upon them.

Jer 44:1-19 The Jews in Egypt refuse to obey the LORD.

Jer 44:20-30 Jeremiah then denounces destruction upon them.

→ Jer 45 The defeat of the Egyptians

Jer 45 A message to Baruch the Scribe.

Jer 46 The Fall of Egypt to Nebuchadnezzar

Jer 46:13 The word that the LORD spake to Jeremiah the prophet, how Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon should come and smite the land of Egypt.

Jer 47 Prophecies against the Philistines.

Jer 48 Prophecies against Moab

Jer 48:42 And Moab shall be destroyed from being a people because he hath magnified himself & against the LORD.

→ Jer 49 Prophecies against Ammon, Edom, Damascene, and Tyre, and Teder and Hazor.

Jer 49:17 Also Edom shall be a desolation: every one that goeth by it shall be astonished, and shall hiss at all the plagues thereof.

Jer 50 Prophecies against Babylon and Chaldea

### [Jeremiah] cont. 13

Jer 50:17 Israel is a scattered sheep, the lions have driven him away: first the King of Assyria hath devoured him; and last this Nebuchadrezzar king of Babylon hath broken his bones.

Jer 50:18 Therefore thus saith the LORD of HOSTS the GOD of Israel; Behold I will punish the king of Babylon and his land, as I have punished the King of Assyria.

Jer 50:33 Thus saith the LORD of HOSTS. The children of Israel and the children of Judah were oppressed together: and all that took them captives held them fast; they refused to let them go.

Jer 50:34 Their REDEEMER is strong;

the LORD of HOSTS is HIS name: HE shall thoroughly plead their cause, that HE may give rest to the land, and disquiet the inhabitants of Babylon.

Jer 51 More details about destruction of Babylon.

Jer 51:19 The portion of Jacob is not like them; for HE is the former of all things: and Israel is the rod of HIS inheritance: the LORD of HOSTS is HIS name.

Jer 51:60 So Jeremiah wrote in a book all the evil that should come upon Babylon, even all these words that are written against Babylon.

### [Jeremiah] cont. 14

Jer 51:61 And Jeremiah said to Seraiah, When thou comest to Babylon and shalt see, and shalt read all these words;

Jer 51:62 Then shalt thou say, O LORD, thou hast spoken against this place, to cut it off, that none shall remain in it neither man nor beast, but that it shall be desolate forever.

Jer 51:63 And it shall be, when thou hast made an end of reading this book, that thou shalt bind a stone to it, and cast it into the river midst of Euphrates:

Jer 51:64 And thou shalt say, Thus shall Babylon sink, and shall not rise from the evil that I will bring upon her: and they shall be weary. Thus far are the words of Jeremiah. see Rev: 18:21
